COURSE DESCRIPTION

An intensive study of the grammar, syntax and vocabulary of Biblical Hebrew, including the study of selected Old Testament passages (including portions in the books of Ruth and Jonah). This course will conclude a study of the grammar as outlined in the Seow textbook. It also includes building up in basic vocabulary of Biblical Hebrew.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, the students will have acquired the following:

1. A knowledge of the basic structure of the Hebrew language
2. A working knowledge of a basic list of Hebrew vocabulary words
3. Ability to read simple passages from the Hebrew Bible.
